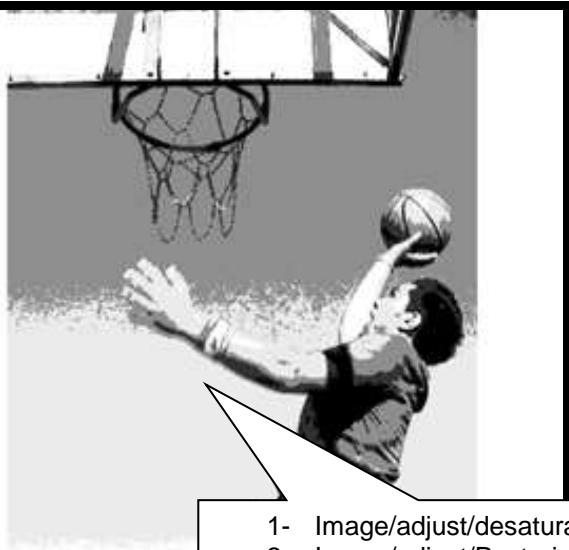


Photoshop Image Manipulation Exercises

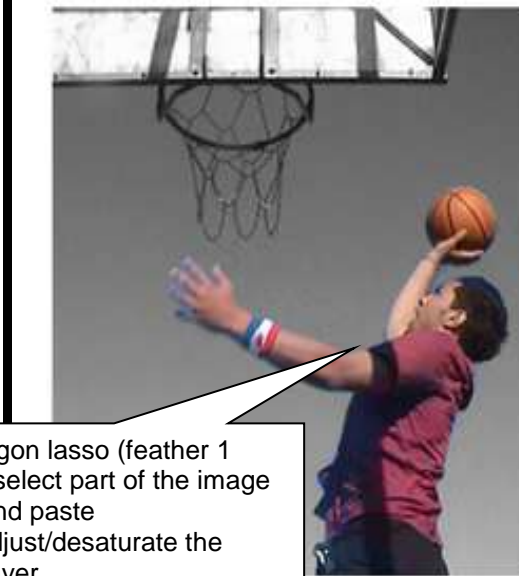
- 1- Create a new page – 19x28cm @ 140 dpi - RGB with white background
- 2- Select an image and copy/paste it six times on the page
- 3- Use the link function – ctrl T – to resize all images (hold shift to maintain proportions)
- 4- Use guides to align images, tick “snap-to” on move tool



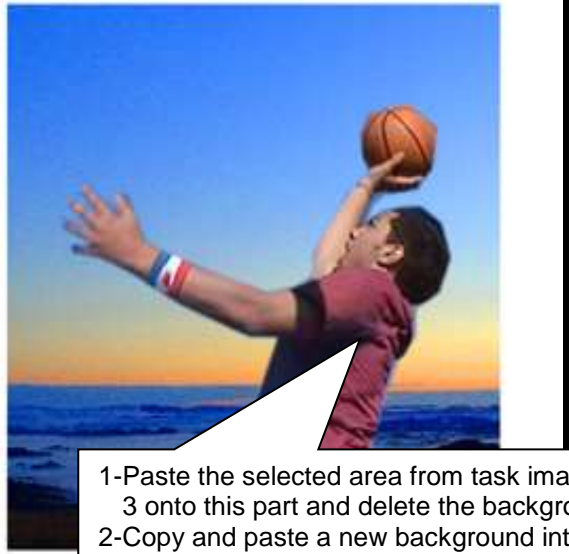
Leave as is – this is your control image



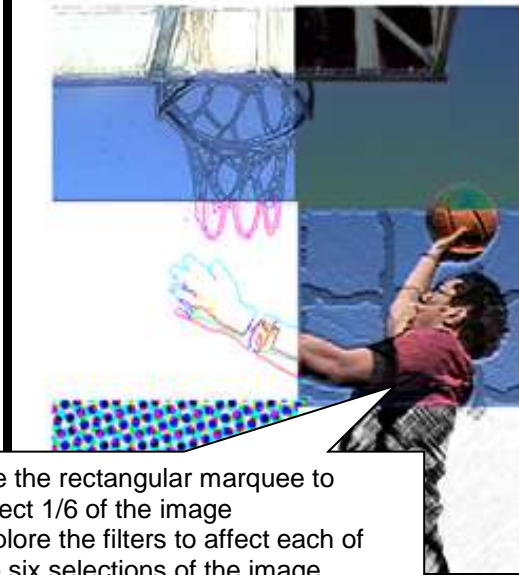
1- Image/adjust/desaturate
2- Image/adjust/Posterise
3- Image/adjust/contrast-brightness



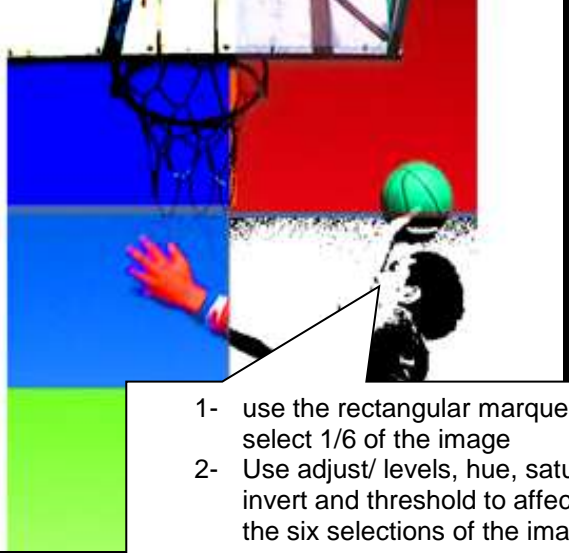
1-Use polygon lasso (feather 1 pixel) to select part of the image – copy and paste
2-Image/adjust/desaturate the bottom layer



1-Paste the selected area from task image 3 onto this part and delete the background
2-Copy and paste a new background into position – reorder layers if required



1- use the rectangular marquee to select 1/6 of the image
2- explore the filters to affect each of the six selections of the image



1- use the rectangular marquee to select 1/6 of the image
2- Use adjust/ levels, hue, saturation, invert and threshold to affect each of the six selections of the image
