



#### CONTOUR DRAWING



Drawing pencils range in hardness from very hard to very soft.

Harder graphite makes lighter lines, and will have a number followed by the letter h, the larger the number the harder the graphite.

Soft graphite makes darker lines and is labeled with a number and the letter B, the larger the number the softer the graphite.

You don't need an entire range to create professional drawings. Choose an HB for sketching, a 2B or 4B for mid darks, a 3H or 5H for lights, and your 6B or so for intense blacks.


Graphite pencils are the most user-friendly drawing medium.

# Drawing style - Sustained Object: A Skull

Research your theme and collect images and objects that relate to it. These will be the subject matter for your future wet and dry works.


### Instructions: Learning Outcome - 1 x A4 Drawing Group of Still Life objects Realistic Tonal Drawing

You need to choose three significant objects. These could be objects you have drawn before for the individual choice board sustained tonal drawings that you have previously created.


If you find drawing realistically a challenge then use an A3 piece of paper INSTEAD of an A4 page to use for this drawing.

If you are using your own objects and you are not using the Still Life resource source photographs provided by your teacher - ensure the composition you create fills the picture frame and uses one of the composition. Think about the orientation of your page. Would a portrait or landscape format work best for your objects.

You need to be drawing from either real objects or from a your own or my provided Still Life setup photographs.






# Composition


Composition is the ways that the objects are arranged in an artwork. The principles of Art should be considered when arranging your objects to ensure your composition has unity, balance, perspective and effectively leads the viewers eye.

Here are four basic compositional arrangements.




## Compositions using a circle and Cross Composition










## How to Draw Eyes









Keep the lines light and sketchy until you're satisfied with the relative size and shape of all the elements.


Begin to lightly shade in the corners of the eye to indicate that they are rounded and slope back into the head.








- Close observation is very important when starting the line drawing of an eye. You must pay particular attention to the difference in shape between the upper and lower eyelids.
- Each eye is unique and the more acute your observation, the more accurate a likeness you will achieve.




#### **Step 2 - Drawing the Iris**



- You should note how the upper eyelid covers the top of the iris.
- Most beginners draw the iris too small and try to fit it within the white of the eye.
- The bottom of the iris usually sits on or very slightly below the lower eyelid.


### Step 3 - The Surface of the Eye



There are two main elements to consider when drawing the glassy surface of the eye:

- A bright glint of reflected light should be left as unshaded paper at the start of the tonal drawing. This will become the brightest element in the eye. This reflection is further enhanced by its contrast with the pupil - the darkest element in the eye.
- The iris contains a variety of tones and flecks which radiate to the centre of the pupil. It is usually darker around its outside edge and lightens towards its centre creating a translucent effect.

### Step 4 - The Eye Socket




- The final step is to render the solidity of the eye socket and surrounding area using graduated tone.
- The upper eyelid casts a shadow which forms a dark curve across the top of the eyeball. This gradually softens into the shaded areas at each corner of the eye.
- Graduated shading is used to cover the outline detail and build up the tone of the eyelids and surrounding area.
- Eyebrows and eyelashes are formed by soft, delicate hairs, so draw these lightly and pay particular attention to the direction of their growth.


### What is the golden ratio?
