<i>E.g. magazine images, old photos, portrait photos, newspaper, pages from old books (you could use an entire old book as a sketch book!), old postcards, old calendar images, black and white photocopies, maps etc.</i> | <input type="checkbox"/> | Old Wallpaper or Wrapping Paper
<i>Try drawing on a textured or patterned paper</i> |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | Baking Paper
<i>Wonderful for tracing and creating LARGE works</i> | <input type="checkbox"/> | Paper Plates |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | Graph Paper | <input type="checkbox"/> | Paper Cups |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | Carbon Paper | <input type="checkbox"/> | Wood
<i>Or any other interesting natural surfaces</i> |

<i>Use scrunched and glued down, folded, ripped, dyed or stained paper or tissue</i> | <input type="checkbox"/> | Black Building Paper or White Paper Painted Black |

<i>Natural or painted (White-Out is good for this)</i> |

<i>E.g. a long thin piece of paper, a tiny square, circle, oval, etc.</i> |

DRAWING MEDIUMS

From found to fancy

- Ballpoint Pens**
Any colours – pens encourage brave drawings!
- Felt Tips**
- Any Pencils**
- Colour Pencils**
- Crayons**
- Sharpies**
Great on plastic
- Whiteboard/Window Markers**
Drawing things that you can see outside, on the window, is a great way to learn about perspective!
- String, Wool or Ribbon**
Anything soft that you can create a line with. You can glue it onto paper or other surfaces
- Pipe Cleaners**
- Wire**
- White Colour Pencil, White Pen or White Crayon**
To use on dark paper
- Ink and Sticks**
You could use kebab sticks or sticks collected outside
- Charcoal and Eraser**
Smudge and erase it with your fingers
- Graphite Pencils**
- Chalk**
To use on the pavement outside

- Chalk Pastels**
- Oil Pastels**
- Oil Sticks**
- Water Soluble Colour Pencils**
- Water Soluble Crayons**
