How does the specific place & time affect the artist or the work by the artist? Who or what were the links you can see or discover to the artist when making this work? Was the artist influenced by events (<i>social, political or cultural</i>) when this work was made?			How did the artist make the work? What materials, techniques & processes did the artist use? How does the making (<i>characteristics & constraints of materials, techniques, technologies</i>) contribute to what the work looks like? Can you identify the approach or style from the way the work is made? How does the artist combine the techniques selected with the visual elements used? What are the characteristics of the artist's personal visual vocabulary? Does the visual &/or technical vocabulary contribute to the reading of the work?						What is the artist telling you-is there a narrative or a story? Why did the artist make this work-what was their intention? How do you know? What decisions did the artist make-in choosing the subject, theme, process, style &/or approach? How does the way the work is put together add to the meaning? Is the meaning/idea evident in the title? Does the artist convey meaning through symbols or objects? What other methods does the artist use to suggest meaning?		

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
