DIGITAL TASK SHEET

YOUR DESIGN BRIEF:

Make a digital collage ISPY page to share with the a local Kindergarten.

By completing these tasks you will demonstrate your understanding of story telling through the selection and arrangement of imagery, experience taking your own photographs, and using sourced imagery to build your own page for the collection.

TASK 1:

Complete the **Brainstorm Page** you used when you visited the Kindy.

The intention of each question on the Brainstorm Page is to explore your options for development and then choose your direction and explain to us, what you are planning on doing.

TASK 2:

Generate a list of images you need to start collecting or organising photographs of. Write this list in your workbook.

Make a Google Doc and start to build up the images you are collecting, based on your list.

REMEMBER TO SEARCH FOR YOUR IMAGES with 'HI RES' at the end of your search - so the images you collect will be good enough to work with.

Save each one to your downloads, as well as copy and pasting it into Google Docs. This will help you later on in the process!

Make sure you have images that relate to the following:

Setting (background to arrange all of your other images on top of) . . .

All of the objects that will fill up your page . . .

Characters or Animals?

As well as what will be hidden within your puzzle page . . .

****Print and paste into your workbook***

TASK 3:

Make your final iSpy page and corresponding puzzle to solve.

Digitally, using Photoshop, or by hand on A3 using collage techniques.

Instructions for creating:

_ Make sure your file is A3 in size and 300 dpi before starting when setting up your digital file (this allows for your work to be printed later to a large scale).

_ Give your page a Title that summarises the theme you have selected to use.

_ When arranging your elements, consider the conventions used in the photography task: Order, Chaos, Symmetry, Framing, Grid, Repetition.

_ Type out your corresponding puzzle page. Consider its layout, legibility, colour and font. What font will work with your theme . . . is it big enough for the kids to read . . . is it clear enough for the kids to read. What writing technique will you use for your puzzle???
